

Students following the bachelors degrees in the list above need a minimum average CGPA of 2.67 (for programmes requiring the UK equivalent of a 2:1 degree) or 2.33 (for programmes requiring the UK equivalent of a 2.2 degree) in their Bachelor's degree programme to apply for Queen Mary's masters programmes from the listed schools.



English language requirements

The School of Business Management requires an overall IELTS score of 7.0. The other two schools require an overall IELTS score of 6.5. More information is available online: qmul.ac.uk/international-students/englishlanguagerequirements.

Pre-sessional English

If you do not meet the English language requirements for direct entry onto the programme, you can take a pre-sessional English language course with us before your programme starts. You can apply via the admissions team and you will then be given an unconditional offer for the English language course.

Finances

Tuition fees for IBA, Karachi students

Students from IBA, Karachi applying through the partnership route will receive a 10% partnership scholarship on their tuition fees; our School of Economics and Finance will offer a 20% scholarship. Tuition fees are listed on the programme pages of our website. There may be other scholarships available depending on the programme, but it is not possible to combine with the partnership scholarship.

Living in London

The total cost of life in London (including housing, food and travel) will be roughly £1,334 per month. Housing on campus is around £181 to £320 per week.

Work in the UK after you graduate

The Graduate Immigration Route enables students to work in the UK for two years after graduating from Queen Mary.

Applying to Queen Mary

Complete your application by Friday 31 May 2024 qmul.ac.uk/international/partnerships/application

Create your log-in details, and upload the following documents:

- A scan of your passport
- · One academic reference
- Your most recent transcript(s) and bachelor degree certificate.
- Evidence of English language such as IELTS (or other accepted English language test)
 (We don't need a Personal Statement or CV but a school may ask for this at a later stage).
- Receive your conditional offer

 If you don't meet all the entry requirements straight away, you will receive a conditional

offer from our admissions team, and you will be invited to accept your offer.

- Apply for housing
 After you accept your offer, you will be directed to apply for your housing. You will receive an email from our housing services team.
- Receive your unconditional offer
 Email your updated documents (as outlined in your conditional offer) such as final transcript or English language results as soon as you have them. As long as you meet the requirements of your conditional offer, you will be given an unconditional offer.
- Apply for your CAS number
 Information about applying for your CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Study) will be included in your unconditional offer. You must include details of your CAS number in your visa application.
- Apply for your visa
 The visa application process can be complicated. Luckily we have lots of advice available through the Queen Mary Advice and Counselling Service: welfare.qmul.ac.uk/international. Make sure you apply as soon as possible!
- Get excited and prepare for your arrival
 We will send you lots of information by email, so please make sure you read it all thoroughly.
