Over the years, IBA has transformed itself from a Business School to one of Pakistan's most dynamic and prominent public sector institutions of higher learning.


IBA offers exceptional learning opportunities in academia, research and innovation. We hone and nurture our youth into effective leaders who transform the world with their progressive leadership.

AMAN Centre for Entrepreneurial Development (IBA AMAN-CED)

IBA AMAN Centre for Entrepreneurial Development (IBA AMAN CED) was established in 2010 with a vision to foster a culture of creativity and innovation that empowers IBA students and the broader community to make meaningful contributions to Pakistan's economy through advances in sustainable entrepreneurship.

The AMAN CED has opened new avenues of growth and economic development for the country. More than 10,500 participants have been trained through various programs including certificates in entrepreneurship, the likes of which include, women entrepreneurship, vocational entrepreneurship, science and technology entrepreneurship, kids' entrepreneurship, and entrepreneurial faculty development workshops.

From 2015 till 2022, around 300 startups have been facilitated and many of them have become companies after leaving the incubation space. From 2016 till 2022, the incubatees of CED have created 1,741 jobs, 1,312 internships generated PKR 1,126 million in revenue. A number of incubatees have secured the seed money for their startups and have significantly grown their teams and businesses.

The Centre has also won the best entrepreneurship pedagogy award for its

programs from the United States Association for Small Business and Entrepreneurship (USASBE) twice in 2017 & 2021.

The Financial Innovation Challenge Fund (FICF) Round 3 under UK-aid funded Financial Inclusion Program managed by the State Bank of Pakistan was awarded to the IBA, Karachi for setting up the Centre for Excellence in Islamic Finance. It was set up with the objective of providing a platform for discovery, enhancement, and dissemination of knowledge in the field of Islamic Finance.

One of the major gaps identified in the growth of Islamic Finance and its widespread adoption was lack of research and development. Therefore, IBA-CEIF stepped forward and signed an MoU with INCEIF University based in Malaysia, as its academic partner. Moreover, IBA-CEIF has collaborated with the Islamic Research and Training Institute (IRTI) and International Shariah Research Academy (ISRA) to cooperate in facilitating research, training and development in the field of Islamic Finance.

During the last 6.5 years, IBA-CEIF has actively contributed towards the growth of the industry by:

- Conducting value-added research
- Offering diverse capacity building professional programs for International Financial Institutions and Corporates



- Relevant research and development projects, trainings, workshops, and coaching services


Karachi Urban Lab

KUL produces critically-oriented, ground-up data on urban Pakistan. Karachi, the country's largest city, serves as a proxy for investigating and understanding the global challenges of urban development, infrastructural provisioning, and climate change. The KUL's core expertise is in urban planning, architecture, anthropology, human geography, GIS, design, and media fields. KUL's mission is to act as an interdisciplinary, collaborative platform of research, teaching, mentoring, and advocacy, as well as a platform for stakeholder engagements and partnerships with local and provincial government representatives, civil society organizations and universities in Pakistan and abroad. The KUL's research output is supported by grants totaling USD \$1,497,177 over the past several years.





Societies Activities

Providing students with opportunities to participate in a variety of intellectual, academic, recreational and physical activities is a core aim of IBA. Engagement in curricular, co-curricular, and service activities and events form a major part of the experience of students during their time at IBA. Students are encouraged to participate in different events and activities that take place throughout the year.

These events simulate the management challenges of real life and play an important role in polishing the social, managerial and marketing skills of students enabling them to represent and promote IBA at national and international events.

The IBA Student Government (ISG) is the governing body of students under the Office of Student Affairs that is designed to enhance the quality of student life, support curricular, co-curricular and service activities, and contribute to the Institute's educational mission.

There are 31 student clubs and societies focusing on co-curricular, extra-curricular, and services scope. Student societies are formed in three distinct clusters, namely:

- Co-curricular Activities Cluster
- Extracurricular Activities Cluster
- Service Activities Cluster

Some of the events organized by the societies are as follows:

- 1. Animal Welfare Society has organized many training sessions for rescuing animals alongside feeding hundreds of stray animals daily.
- 2. Jam Room has been inaugurated at the IBA Main Campus in 2022 for students interested in playing and learning musical instruments.
- IBA Finance Club organized a month-long IBA's Virtual Stock Market Challenge, iStockX22 where over 500 students intensely engaged and executed 10,000 trades.
- 4. More than 15,000 students participated in ENIGMA, a flagship event of the IBA Arts and Photography Society, in the past 5 years.
- 5. IBA Community Welfare Society raised around PKR 2 million in a fundraiser concert, organized three successful blood drives (two of them were conducted in interior Sindh), and helped 300 families by providing them with ration bags during Ramazan.
- 6. IBA Public Speaking Society organized its flagship event MUNIK XII. IBA entered Model United Nations arena in 2008, and within a span of only a year had emerged as one of the strongest MUN teams in the world not only by winning events at the national level but also receiving accolades at the NMUN.NY at the UN Headquarters, EuroMUN, MUNTR and Harvard WorldMUN.

Health and Wellness

The Wellness Center provides healthcare facilities to students studying at the IBA with an aim to help them improve their physical, and psycho-social wellbeing. It addresses students' psychological, emotional, social, and behavioral concerns that include anxiety, depression, isolation, academic stress, confidence and self-esteem, homesickness (in case of living away from home) among various other issues and challenges.

The Wellness Center also provides Wellness Counseling services to students ensuring their safety and confidentiality. Some of the services it provides are:

- To help students deal with different challenges and stressors they face in their social, academic, and personal life.
- To help students define goals, plan action and gain insights through psychoeducation, counseling and various psychotherapeutic interventions.
- Evaluate a student's performance and implement appropriate intervention strategies
 provide follow up sessions for smooth transition.
- Provide mental health support through individual counseling sessions with wellness counselors/clinical psychologists.
- Walk-in sessions are also provided to students to address a crisis or an immediate need students are seen on a first come, first served basis.
- Organize support groups, workshops, trainings, and other activities to develop coping skills and disseminate mental health awareness.
- All information shared during counseling sessions, including the student's identity, is kept strictly confidential except in cases where it is deemed that the student may seriously harm themselves or another person, in which case, their legal guardians and authorized persons at the IBA are notified.

Erasmus Research Projects

The School of Mathematics and Computer Science has won three research projects recently. The School's faculty is heavily involved in European Union research projects.

Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization

The Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC) was established in 2011 under the guidelines from HEC with the aim to facilitate the country's policymakers by providing sound academic expertise in the decision-making process.

Applied research conducted at the Institute not only facilitates the decision-making bodies, NGOs, transnational organizations, and businesses but also transforms individuals into scholars.

IBA Karachi wants to set a standard of excellence and outline new frontiers in research, innovation and commercialization.

The HEC measures institutional performance through a 'Self-Assessment Scorecard' on an annual basis. For the year 2021–22, ORICs were asked to furnish their performance on the scorecard having the Key Progress Indicators (KPIs) particularly under four major aspects. Out of 77 recognized ORICs across private and public HEIs in Pakistan, only five institutions secured a place in 'W' category.

The IBA secured the first spot in Sindh and second across Pakistan.

Social Inequality Lab

The Social Inequality Lab aims to promote research on social issues in Pakistan. The core mission is to maintain and expand the social inequality database, including income and consumption, health inequalities, education, land, gender, and other social inequalities.

Economic Growth and Forecasting Lab

The purpose of the Economic Growth and Forecasting Lab is to evaluate and estimate various types of machine learning algorithms and statistical models using big data (where it is available) to predict various macroeconomic, financial variables, and socio-economic indicators. It paves the way to shape economic policy and sheds light on the main indicators of growth and recession.

Psychology Research and Testing Lab

Psychology Research and Testing Lab is developed to scientifically study processes linked to human behavior. It aims to facilitate students, faculty and research scholars in building applied knowledge of psychology by conducting psychological experiments, assessment of personality and human behavior, and data analysis.

Artificial Intelligence (AI)

The Artificial Intelligence Lab at SMCS provides a forum for the development of intelligent systems and discussions on emerging technologies within the field of Al. In addition to building international alliances/partnerships, the lab aims to foster collaboration with local industry by developing intelligent solutions for problems pertinent to the Pakistani market. The lab regularly organizes workshops for professionals in the field of robotics and data analytics. The lab has achieved research grants from the National ICT R&D Fund, the Higher Education Commission, and the Third World Academy of Sciences. The lab collaborates very actively with the Innovation and Enterprise Research Lab, University of Technology Sydney (UTS). Several team members have not only visited UTS for a few months, but a couple of them have joined UTS on full scholarships to pursue their PhDs.

Big Data

The BDA-Lab comprises of five state-of-the-art IBM server machines with pre-installed GPUs. The BDA-Lab provides dockerized GPU access and big data infrastructures for IBA's courses and activities. BDA-Lab primarily facilitates PhD scholars, MS students, and FYP students in their research activities

Telecommunications and Research Lab (TRL)

The Telecommunications Research Lab at SMCS focuses on research being conducted by PhD students and faculty members in the areas of Wireless Sensor Networks and Mobile Networks with a particular emphasis on performance analysis, simulation, and applications of machine learning in areas of wireless sensor networks and IoT. The lab has invested in several Wireless Sensor Network lab equipment and has expertise in state-of-the-art simulation software including NS2, NS3, Avrora, and QualNet. Faculty and students at the TRL frequently contribute to international conferences and journals and are active participants in international workshops and trainings.

Web Sciences Lab

The Web Sciences Lab focuses on research being conducted in the area of Web Information Retrieval and Human-Computer Interaction. Research topics include machine reading comprehension for local languages, linked data processing, performance improvement of contextual search engines, and development of novel interfaces for web searching and retrieval.

Business Review

The Business Review, a peer-reviewed biannual journal, is the official publication of the IBA. It is an internation journal that publishes refereed papers on both established and emerging aspects of business and social sciences. Its objective is relevant for decision and policymakers. The journal places strong emphasis on theoretical and empirical studies, evaluation activities implementation research and ways of improving the practice of business.
